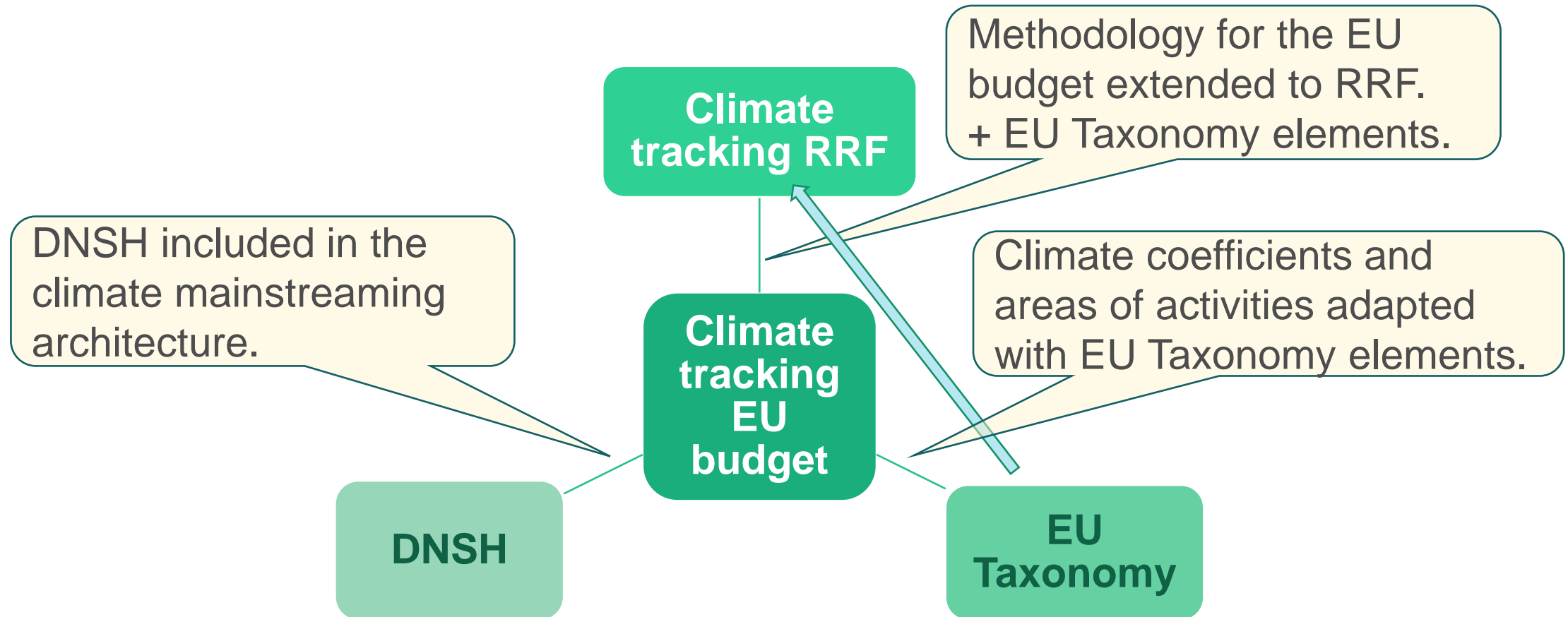

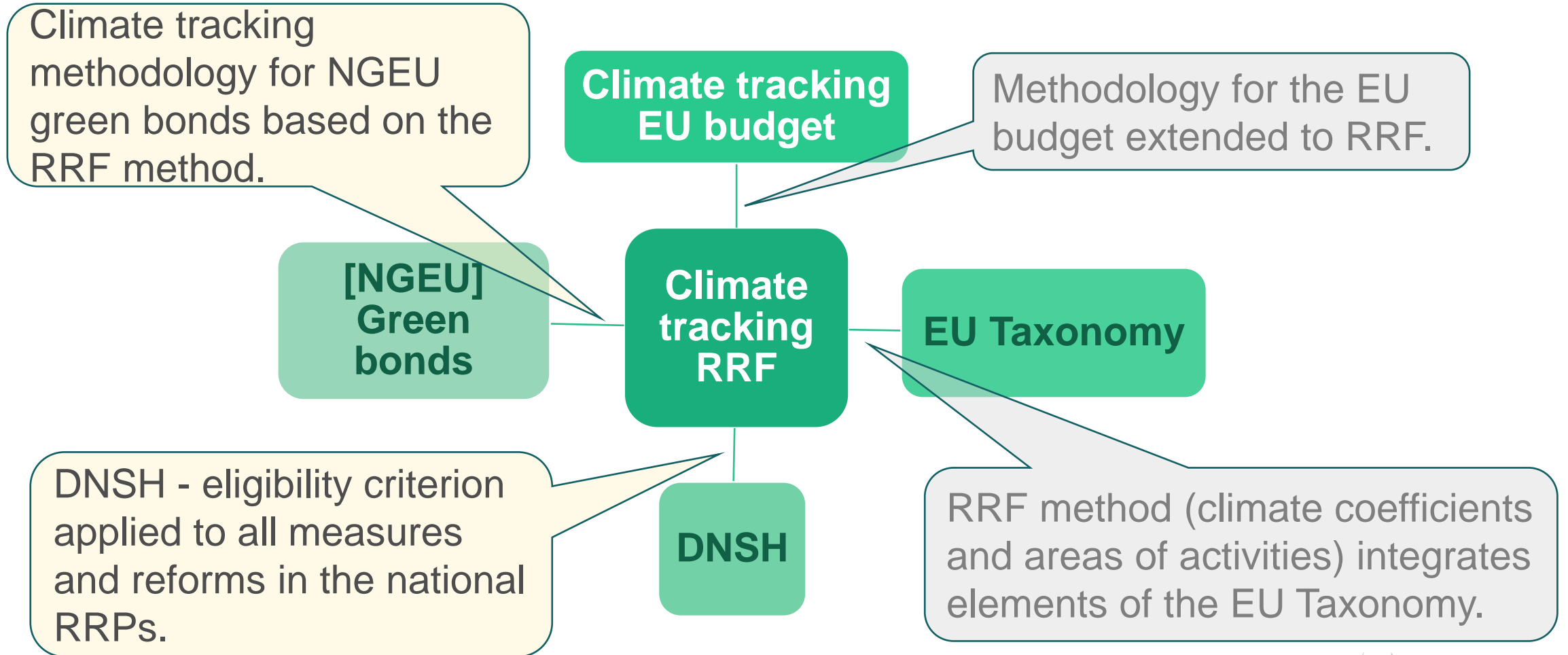

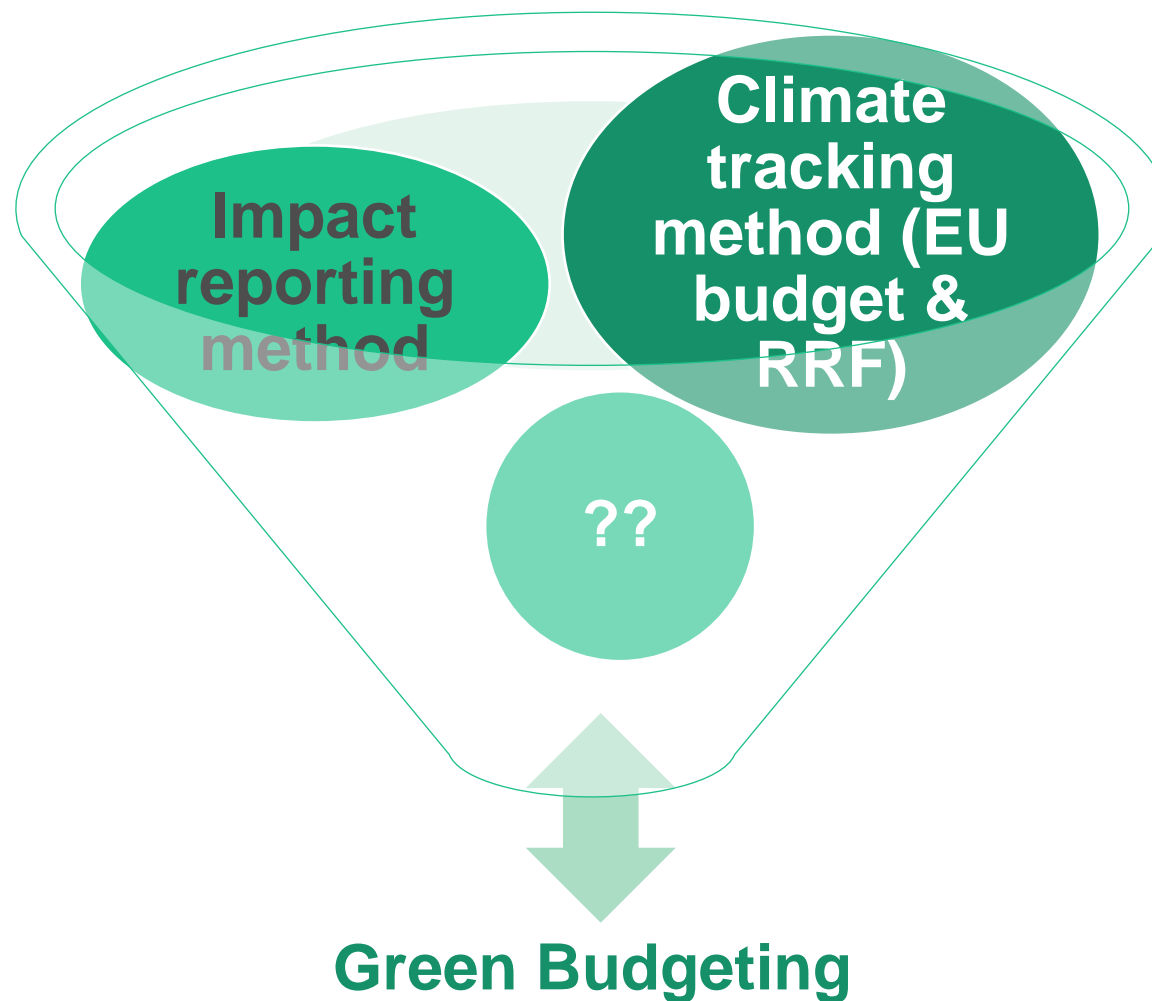

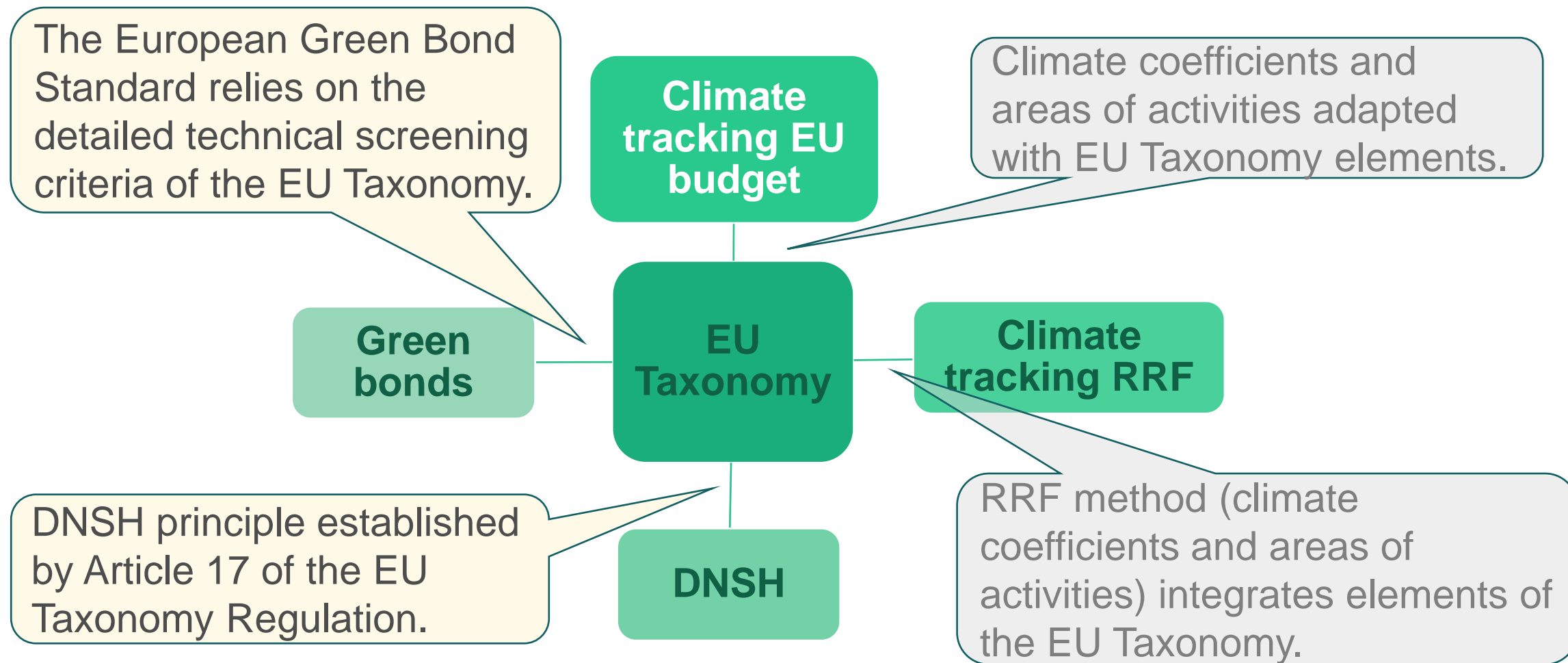


Links between climate tracking in the EU budget and RRF & Green Budgeting

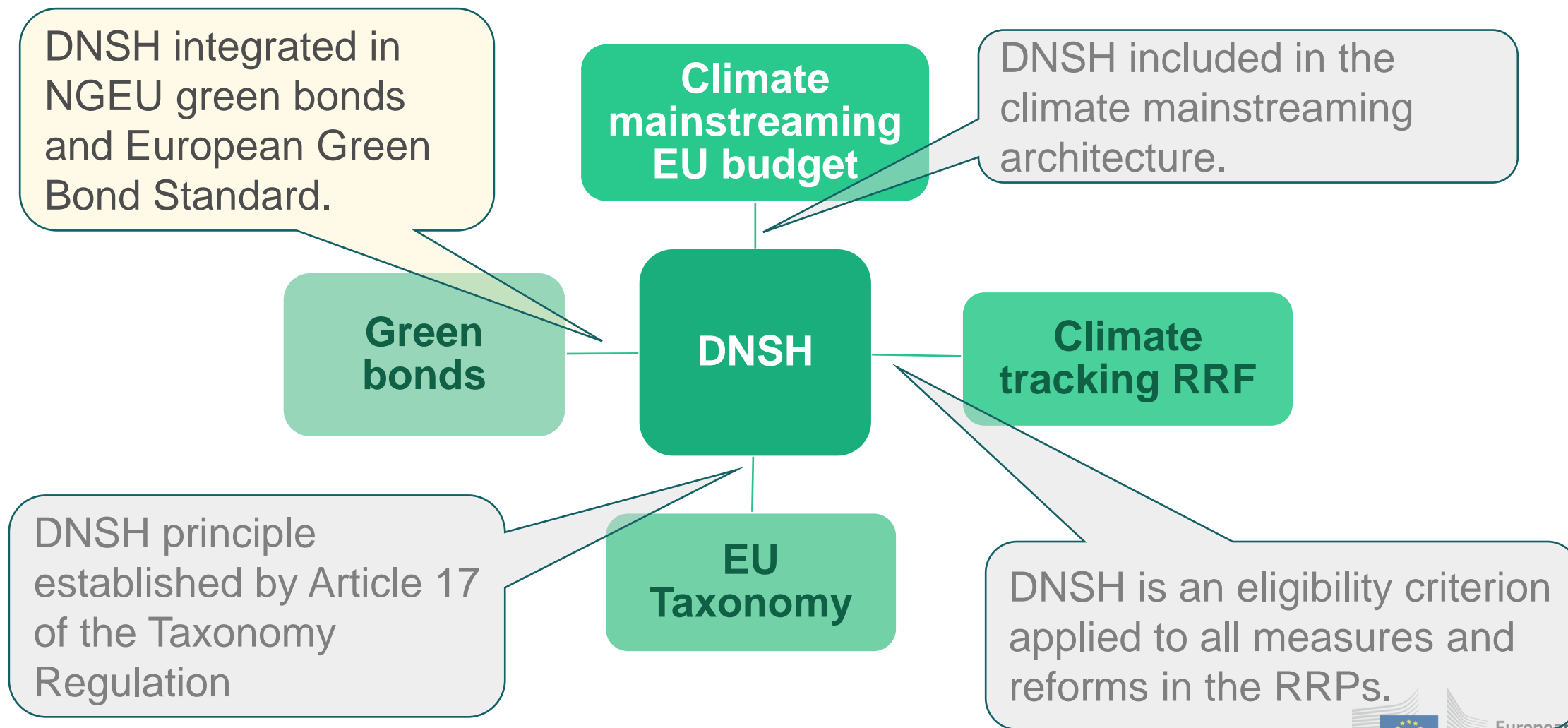

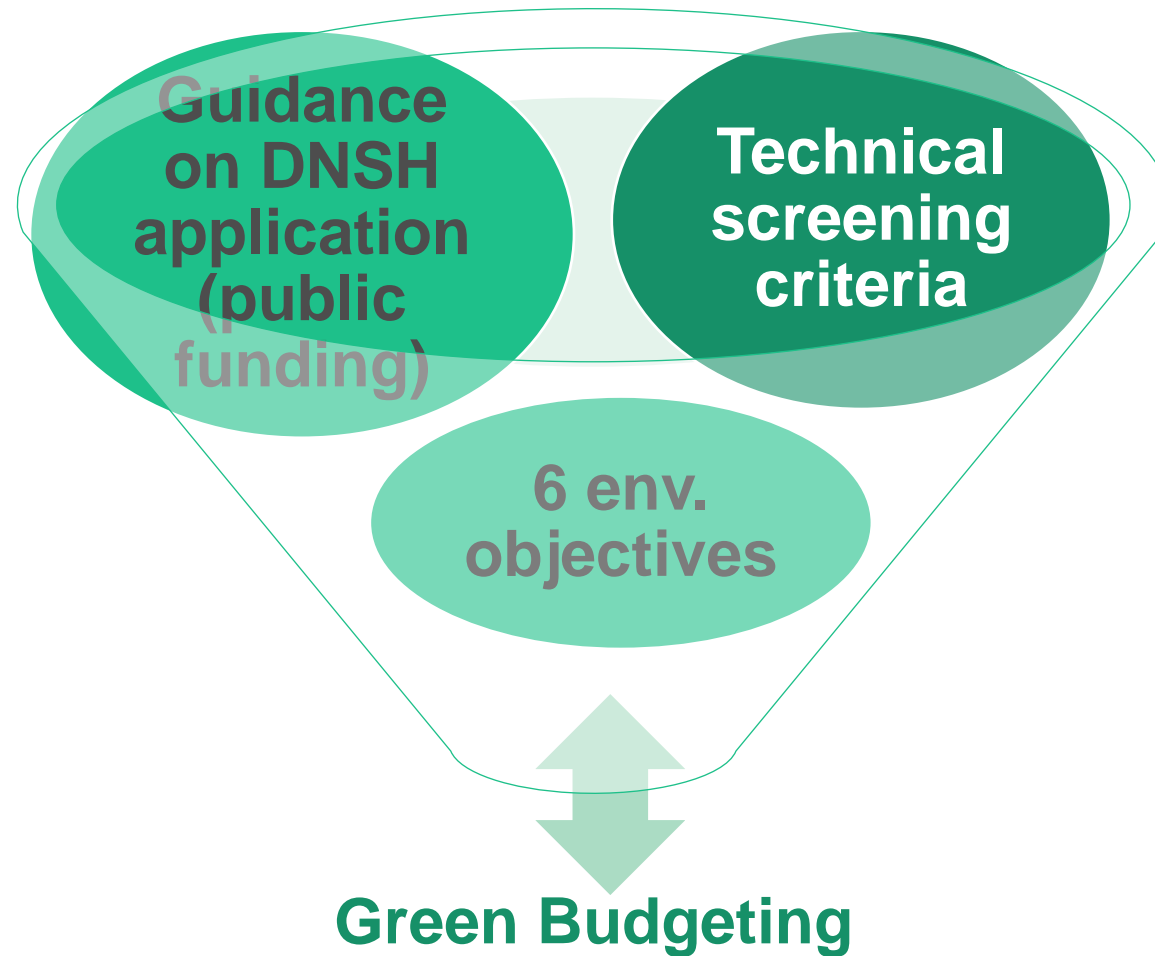

DNSH principle in public funding

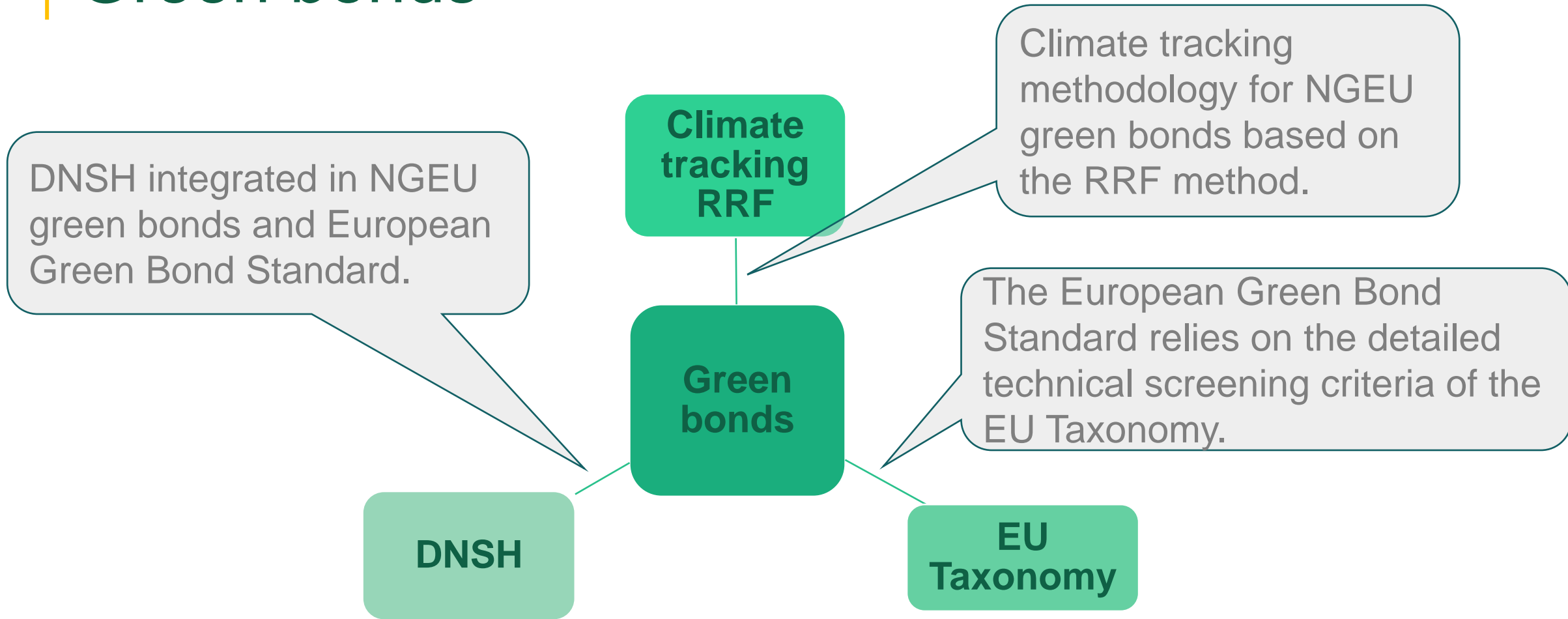


Links between EU Taxonomy and DNSH & Green Budgeting

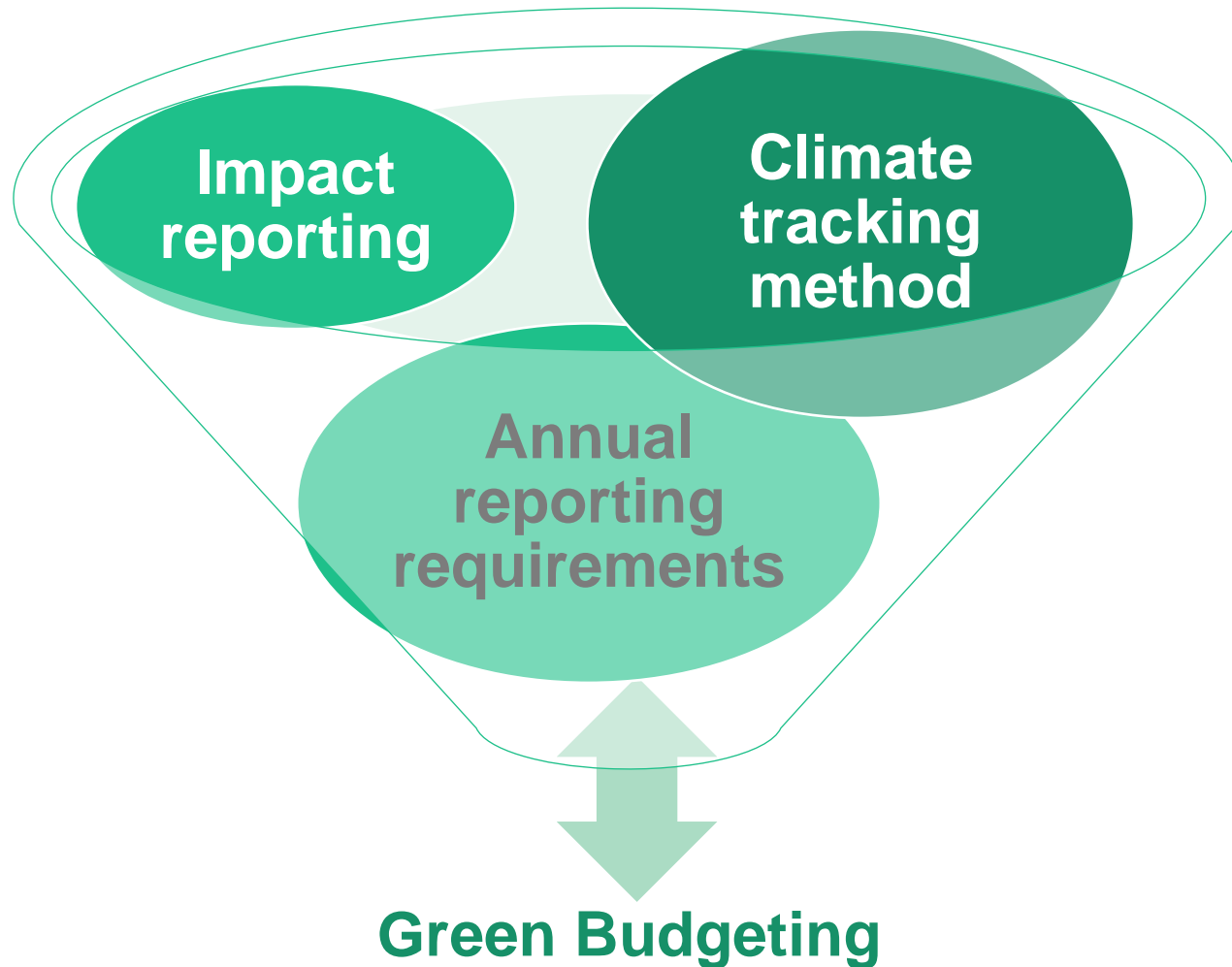

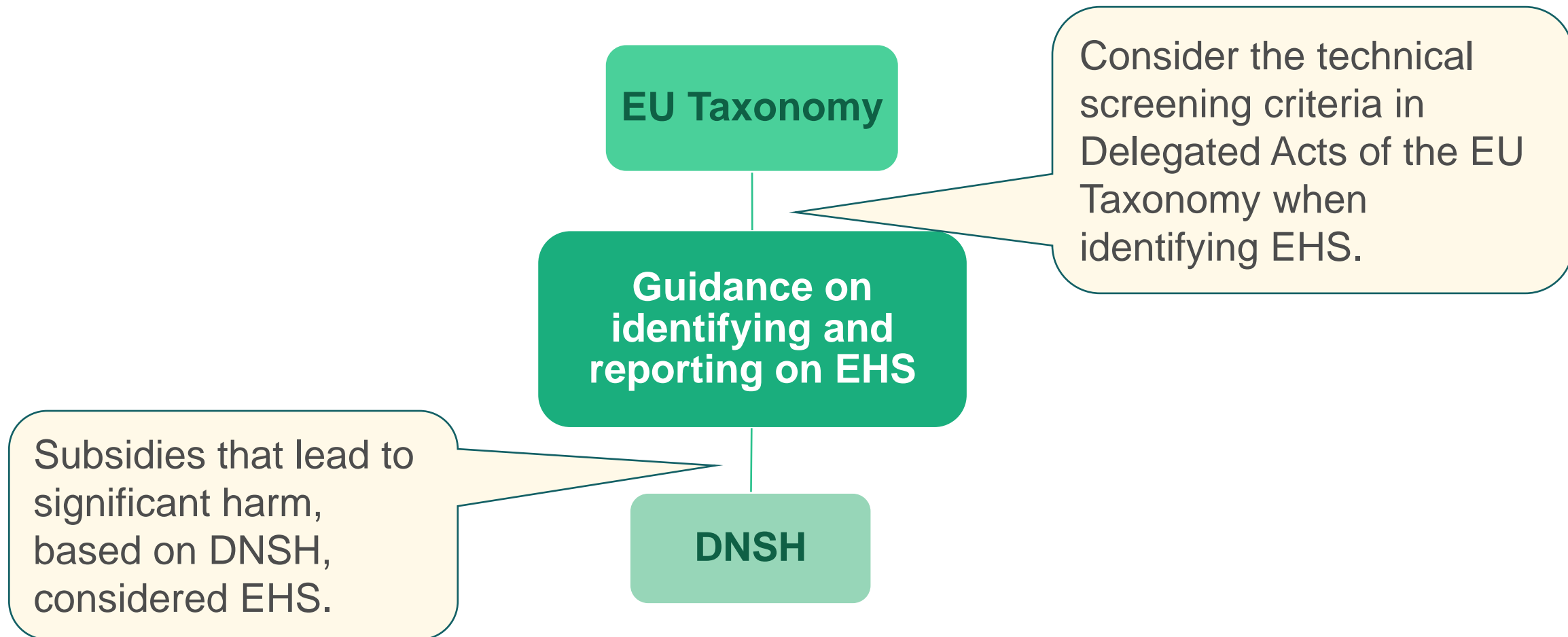


Links between Green bonds & Green Budgeting

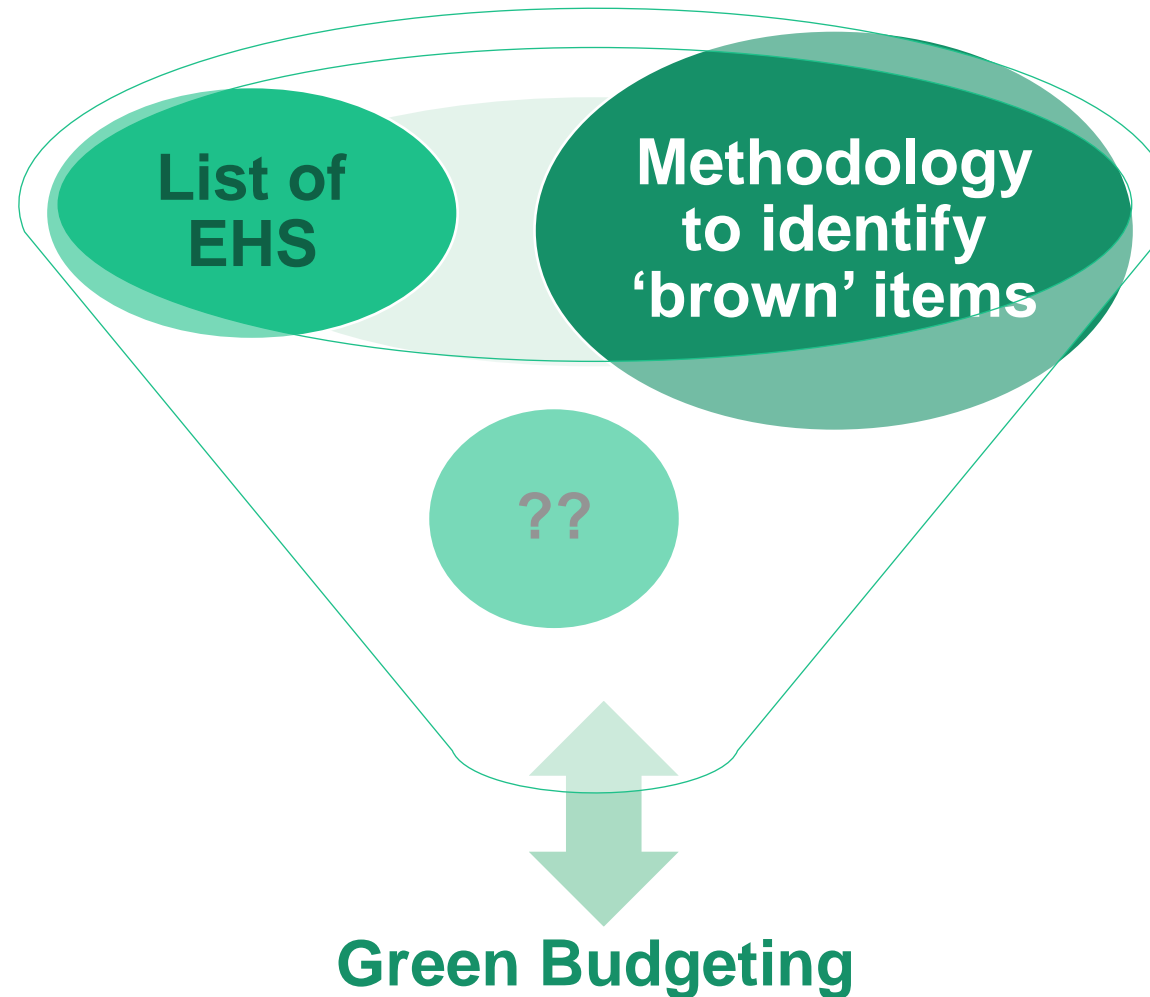
